




Brief History of the Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas



hen I retired from The Gurkha Reserve Unit in 2001, I had dreams of relaxing and enjoying life after having served almost 40 years in the British Army and with The Gurkha Reserve Unit in Brunei. This was not to be as I was approached by Captain Ash Bahadur Gurung who had retired from the 2nd Gurkhas and had amongst other activities joined The Rotary Club of Mount Everest. He was well versed with what a Rotary Club could do and during our frequent meetings urged me to form and lead a Rotary Club consisting of retired personnel from the Brigade of Gurkhas. The idea sounded very productive as we were all well-disciplined people

and did not have much to do and we could actually do good to the communities where we were born. This was the seed that Captain Ash Bahadur Gurung planted and it has now grown into a solid tree capable of weathering all types of weather.

The initial steps of forming a club began in earnest in Captain Ash Bahadur's house. Frequent meetings were held with Captain Ash Bahadur Gurung doing most of the taking as he was the one with the experiences of how a Rotary Club should be run. The search for potential members was not a problem but the rules and regulations

that had to be followed when establishing a Rotary Club was alien to us. Initially we needed a well established Rotary Club to sponsor us and in this we were adopted by The Rotary Club of Kathmandu North with the District nominating The Governor's Special Representative GSR, now known as The Assistant Governor, to show us the correct ways of running a Rotary Club. It should be noted that all rotary clubs of Nepal came under the rotary district of Calcutta and all the Nepali Rotary Officials were very interested and keen in establishing the right number of clubs and only then could we have our own Rotary District. We were assisted greatly by the DG Dr. Tika Man Baidhya and District Secretary Dilendra Shrestha. The duo visited our club very frequently and gave us all the assistance we needed in negotiating the Rotary minefield. The Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas was, is and will remain grateful to them for all their help and guidance during our infancy. With all the preparations ready the club was chartered on 10 September 2003 with His Excellency The British Ambassador as the Chief Guest at the Radisson Hotel. We thought it very appropriate to invite him as the club consisted of 99% retired personnel from the Brigade of Gurkhas.


With our sheltered life over we ventured into the big world looking for projects to help the people in our respective villages in improving their lives be it minutely but it was not as easy our Gurus lead us to believe. Apart from a few medical camps nothing significant was achieved. Undaunted we continued with our Rotary journey falling, stumbling and at times running!!After my three year's stint as the Charter President I was replaced by Major Yam Bahadur Gurung, BEM and he took on the new job like fish to water and with his International contacts, primarily from the UK, minor projects started rolling in with a few Major Grant Projects. The sagging flag of the Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas started fluttering strongly in the wind once more and the morale definitely took an upturn!! He too carried the flag for a further three years and handed over his responsibilities to Major Lilbahadur Gurung, MBE who took the club performances to a new height. During his three years tenure as President of the club our international players grew in numbers and we managed to get many more minor grants and considerable number of major/global grants. It was during his Presidency that he managed to finance and supervise the construction of The Rotary Chautari in his village of Sirubari in Syangja. Rotary Chautari depicts the story of the improvements that Rotary has been able to make to the rural areas of Nepal where our efforts have been concentrated from the very beginning. From the beginning till the present date we have had 11 Presidents who have all given their very best to further enhance the reputation and the name of the club. I feel that I must mention the first class job that our PP Siri Prasad Gurung has done for the club. He has much improved the relationship with our International partners as well as our relationship with the district officials. It is through his efforts that our club is now well known as one of the very active and vibrant clubs.

So far we have managed to complete a large number of major/global and minor projects in the rural areas of Nepal. Our motto from the very beginning was that we would bring a smile on the face of the poor village people where our roots lie and I am very confident that we have succeeded in fulfilling our commitments as per our motto.

I can not end this short article without thanking Captain Ash Bahadur Gurung for his vision, foresight and insistence without which The Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas would not be in existence today. Thank you AB Saheb. I would like to end by saying that our club members can be justly proud of our achievements over the last 20 years and as the Charter President of the Club I am proud to belong to such a vibrant club.



COMPUTERISATION PROJECT HIGH SCHOOLS IN ANDHI KHOLA VALLEY

The demand for IT suits in Government schools throughout remote hills is very high indeed. With this in mind The Himalayan Gurkhas initiated a Pilot scheme in two schools, one in Kaski and another one in Syangja in 2011 to install Information Technology classrooms. The Pilot scheme was so successful that the donor clubs and individuals in the UK were enthused to take IT project a step further. As a result The Himalayan Gurkhas and the UK donors, managed to install IT suits in 7 schools in Panchamul valley, 2 schools in Kaski, one in Gorkha and a college in Chitwan between 2011 and 2015

The demand for IT suits was overwhelming. Schools one after another continued submitting application to The Himalayan Gurkhas for IT suits. There were number of questions which required satisfactory reply, prior to search for a donor. The questions are: a. Is the school Government funded? b. How large is the school, both students and infrastructure? c. Will there be a separate class room for IT suit? d. Is the school connected to main power? e. Does the school have a qualified teacher? f. Does school have back up fund for repair and replacements? And so on. A selected team members with a bit of knowledge in IT, were then tasked to and the "NEED ASSESSMENT" was carried out.

The High schools dotted either side of Andhi Khola river, beginning at Karkineta in the North (a border town

between Syangja and Parbat districts) all the way down to Shree Laxmi High school at Waling Syangja in the South were visited several times to determine the need and find if they meet the criteria set by the team. The project team lead by Major Lilbahadur Gurung MBE assisted by Rtn Krishna Prasad Adhikari were convinced that the following 9 schools met minimum requirements:

- Shree Maidan High School, Maidan, Bange
- Shree Rastriya High School, Bichari Chautara, Pakhribot
- Shree Saraswati High School, Naudanda
- Shree Pradumna Paneru High School, Seti Dovan
- Shree Bhagawati High School, Faparthum
- Shree Jana Pradip High School, Chilaunebaas
- Shree Sepat Siran Chaur High School, Bangsing
- Shree Andha Andhi High School, Bichari Chautara
- Shree Laxmi High School, Waling

While carrying out visits and need assessments in schools, search for the donors was also in progress. With many well-wishing Rotarian friends in the UK a kindhearted donor was found in the name of **The Repper Charitable Foundation (TRCF)**. **Mr David and Mrs Lynda Repper with Natalie (dau) are the Trustees.** TRCF is London based Registered Trust.

The Himalayan Gurkhas and The Repper Charitable Foundation partnered with EduTech Nepal (ETN) for technical support and the serious business of installation of IT suits in schools began in early 2018. Despite many logistical and administrative difficulties, the IT suit installation project began and completed on time. The donors made couple of visits to the project sites and were satisfied that their Nepal pet project was a success.

The beneficiary schools are keeping up with the IT teaching. Some schools have acquired more Laptops for both educational teaching and for administrative purposes.

The Himalayan Gurkhas is hopeful all it's effort in ushering 21st Century technology in the remote hill schools will be utilized proper and the future generations are given an education of lifetime in their own doorsteps.

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GIRLS SANITARY KIT DISTRIBUTION AND SUSTAINABILITY PROJECT

Periods in Nepal still has a stigma surrounding it despite being completely natural and normal around the Globe. In majority of the schools in Rural Nepal, many girls skip school for 4/5 days a month to avoid being harassed and for treated as untouchables. The girls are also unaware of their personal hygiene and "how to look after themselves during the menstrual period".

In many parts of Nepal girls are still treated as something impure, dirty, contaminating and untouchables during the monthly periods. During this period girls are alienated from the family and society during their periods. They are imposed with social restrictions and face humiliation in front of their friends and peers.

Rotary club of The Himalayan Gurkhas has been working with Rotarian friends from Yorkshire, England, United Kingdom since 2011 in various initiatives. Besides computerization of schools, the Rotarians have been involved in educating the locals, addressing and minimize the problems, the schools' girls were facing. The exercises have had good impression amongst the local women, schoolgirls and the local community.

Objectives: The Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas has had the following objectives:

- a. Focus on menstrual health related issues in the remote hills and try to overcome it.
- Educate and impart knowledge to the victims of decades long inhumane practices and empower the victims and potential victims.
- c. Improve access to menstrual health,

appropriate sanitation, and hygiene facilities in the remote hill schools.

 Work with local Government, private sectors, and the well-wishers across the Globe to provide and improve supply chain of menstrual health products.

Girls Hygiene Kit distribution project:

With the generous donation received from Dame Joanna Lumley the Himalayan Gurkhas has established a girls Hygiene Kit distribution point and resource centre in the western hill village in Syangja. The Himalayan Gurkhas Rotary club choose a cluster of villages, named Panchamul Valley, in Syangja district in West Nepal as it's project target area. With the money received from Dame Lumley the following has been achieved:

- Establish a small production centre where a trained lady worker prepares the girls hygiene kit.
- Establish a small Girls Hygiene Kit sell/distribution centre.
- Distribution of Girls Hygiene Kit to all 6
 Secondary and one Lower Secondary school in Panchamul valley.

Total number of beneficiary Girls: 747 from 7 schools.

Implementation of project. The project was implemented in two phases:

- Phase 1: The team visited several schools in Panchamul valley and distributed Girls hygiene kit. The project work was completed in 2 days.
- **b. Phase 2:** Team of four, led by Major Lilbahadur Gurung MBE, Mr Krishna Prasad

Adhikari and Ms Sunita Adhikari and Driver Chandra Ghalan (Tamang) spent three days in the target area, visiting 4 secondary schools and one Lower Secondary school, spread across Panchamul valley.

- c. The team has also established a hygiene kits production workshop. A lady has been given 6 weeks sewing training and has started producing a girls' hygiene kit.
- d. The team has also rented a small shop to keep produced hygiene kits in a resource centre from where the hygiene kits are sold to schoolgirls in a "give away" cost.

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THE FIRST INTERNET ACCESS TO PANCHAMUL VALLEY

ommunication plays a vital role in the rapid development of a nation. When communication is advanced and efficient, the transmissions of ideas and opinions will be quick and will help to carry out development activities successfully and efficiently. Likewise, communication is essential if the educational institutes are to prepare students to face the challenges of 21st century and prepare Nepali youths to compete against manpower from developed countries.

In 2011, when IT project began in Panchamul valley dreaming of connecting a remote hill village school with internet was no more than just a dream. However, the members of The Himalayan Gurkhas were determined to give it a try. Several coordinating meetings were held between the service providers, the members of the Himalayan Gurkhas and the technical teams prior to recce of potential hill tops sites to erect the necessary infrastructure. To provide internet in the remote hil schools was a major challenge. The technical team with supervision and leadership of Panchamul valley IT and internet project

coordinator Major Lilbahadur Gurung continued to search for suitable hilltop locations where electricity was available, and security of internet relay masts and equipment was guaranteed. The task wasn't easy but some how sites were found and to our relief the project began to take shape.

I, with Yoken (now my husband) were given an opportunity to

support technically throughout the project. There were many challenges enroute but we had an opportunity to learn a lot from this project. Of many projects Panchamul valley internet project was one of the most rewarding experiences for us. Our work wouldn't have been successful without constant supervision and guidance by the members of The Himalayan Gurkhas RC and from Major Lilbahadur GURUNG MBE.

With all infrastructures in place, the school in Panchamul valley was connected to the outside world through internet network in November 2012. The internet breakthrough was celebrated with a video



conference between members of the Himalayan Gurkhas and the members of Harrogate Brigantes RC. Many locals including local dignitaries, teachers, students and well wishers were present to witness the event.

The benefit from it is immense to the beneficiary schools and the students in the schools concerned. As I write these notes, I realize that Panchamul valley has been connected with commercial internet service providers and has internet service commercially. However, the internet service used in the schools are still the ones provided by RC The Himalayan Gurkhas. I and my technical team take pride in being a part of this worthwhile project under the leadership of the members of RC The Himalayan Gurkhas

Hiking to a hilltop, riding on a roof top of a local bus on bumpy seasonal road and social events in the evening with the locals is something we will always cherish. And well, what a welcome you gave us with the all the school coming out to greet us. I can still remember every part of the day, the welcome speeches and dances, the handing over of the computers and our inspection of the classroom where we were to install the 9 laptops.

As each day progressed we moved from installing the equipment to running a 6 day IT induction course for your teachers. Many friendships were made which have continued over many years. THE GURKHAS AND THEIR HERITAGE





"It is better to die than to be a coward" is the Gurkha soldier's motto.

Over 600 years ago, before the time of Prithvi Narayan Shah, I wonder how the Nepali warriors stood against numerous attacks on their villages. Our family history speak of hundreds of small regional heads who carved their own family clans. Life must have been quite tough in those days, the ability to fight and to survive in such hilly and remote terrain that was utmost important. This life style produced the finest potential Gurkha soldiers who began to be recognised around the world. Then Prithvi Narayan Shah came in 1700 to lead the nation from his base in Gorkha and ruled Nepal as one country, having taken Kathmandu.

The 1814 -16 Anglo-Nepal War stands out in the










Gurkha history when the Nepali soldiers clashed with the British East India Company in northern parts of India. At a high ground feature near Dehra Dun called Kalunga only 600 Gurkhas fought against 4000 troops of the East India Company. What the British Commander thought it would be easily taken within a week became a one month battle to win, resulting in the British General killed but his commanders erected two stones - one engraved for their soldiers and the other to their adversaries, such was their respect for these Nepali warriors. The Gurkhas were also clever in tactics. In this battle, they chose a high ground which had steep slopes on the enemy side and gentle slope on their side so that they could identify the enemy and fire their weapons from the top while they were supplied with ammunition and ration from the rear, the principles of defense that even today is taught in the British Army. Sadly, the King of Nepal could not send reinforcements from Kathmandu while General Amarsing Thapa struggled to hold his positions to the far west of Nepal, in those days stretched as far as Dehra Dun in west and Sikkim in east. As a result in 1816 the Treaty of Sagauli was signed and Nepal had to give up land leaving only the current borders. What is also significant at this time is that Gurkhas began to be recruited

into the British East India Company (later to be replaced by the British Army). Frederick Young, a young British Officer who was taken prisoner by Gurkhas quickly appreciated the quality of his adversaries and obtained permission to recruit these fierce warriors. In 1815, initially three Regiments were raised which were later formalized as 1st Gurkha Rifles, 2nd Gurkha Rifles and the 3rd Gurkha Rifles. Later 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th and 11th Gurkha Rifles were formed.

When the Indian Mutiny took place in 1857, the Gurkha soldiers demonstrated their loyalty so strongly when they decided to side with the British rather than the mutiny soldiers. It started with a reason given by the mutineers that the musket gun powder packets were greased with cow and pig fat, a very holy action against Hindu and Muslim belief. When The Sirmoor Rifles (Later called the 2nd Gurkha Rifles) were called to support a British Division attack on the mutineers at Delhi, they marched from Dehra Dun and took position in Hindu Rao house as the east picquet. On the first night the British artillery guns were pointed at the Gurkha Battalion at night just in case but they realized there was no need when dawn came! After the mutineers






were rounded up, Queen Victoria was so pleased by the whole action that she presented the Queen's Truncheon to replace the 2GR flag. The Regimental Association still celebrate Delhi Day on 14 September every year and pay their respect to the Queen's Truncheon now held by the Royal Gurkha Rifles in the UK.

During World War 1, World War 2 and the Borneo Confrontation, the Gurkhas won 13 Victoria Cross (VC), the highest bravery award in the British Army. In addition two Gurkhas of 8th Gurkha Rifles won the George Cross (GC) (sometimes called the civilian VC) for saving women and children from collapsing buildings in 1935 when there was a terrible earthquake in Quetta (now in Pakistan). They fought in Malaya, the Gulf War and the Falklands War. Lately they have taken part in operations in Afghanistan and other UN operations. Sergeant Dip Prasad Pun from the Royal Gurkha Rifles fought against 40 Talibans in Afghanistan defending his post at night and was awarded the Conspicuous Gallantry Cross (CGC), the second highest bravery award in the British Army.

After India received it's independence in 1947, four Gurkha Regiments parted to join the British Army while the remaining seven Gurkha Regiments remained with the Indian Army. In 1994, the four Gurkha Regiments (2nd, 6th, 7th







and 10th) in the British Army amalgamated to form the Royal Gurkha Rifles. To date apart from the VCs and GCs, Gurkhas continue to win other bravery awards such as Param Vir Chakra and Vir Chakra in India and the DCM (Distinguished Conduct Medal), the Military Medal (MM) and Military Cross (MC) in the British Army while on military operations.

"I have never seen more steadiness or bravery exhibited in my life. Run they would not and of



death they seemed to have no fear, though their comrades were falling thick around them, for we were so near that every shot hold."



SAFETY MATERIALS DISTRIBUTION TO NEEDY PEOPLE DURING COVID - 19 PANDEMIC

members, Head Teachers, teachers and the locals were present to receive their much needed COVID – 19 safety materials.

The quantities of Facemasks and sanitizers distributed are as follows:

Facemask: Qty 6 per teacher and per child.

Sanitizer: Qty 5ltrs jar per 30 children (appx)

In each distribution point the local Ward chairman, the chairman of school management committee or Head teacher thanked Dame Lumley for her continued support to thousands of school children in the remote hills of Nepal.

The speakers also thanked Rotary club of THE HIMALAYAN GURKHAS for their sterling work for the needy people of the remote hills of Nepal.

The covid-19 safety materials were distributed to total 3,977 number of students and 238 teachers in 14 schools of Syangja, Kaski and Lamjung. Total

29,290 pieces of facemasks and 117 jar (5 Ltr in a jar) of Sanitizers were distributed.

The Face Masks are made of three layers and are water resistance. They are re-washable and reusable and are suitable for indoor and outdoor activities, including physical activities. The distribution of face masks and hand sanitizers

was the need of the day as the Government, time and again were unable to help schools of their requests due to lack of funds available at a local level.

Distribution of free Face Masks and Hand Sanitizers was one of the most self-satisfying projects ever taken by The Himalayan Gurkhas. For the project team there was a high risk of catching COVID -19, however, the trip was a risk worth taking. I on behalf of all the beneficiary schools, teachers, students, and parents I would like to thank Dame Lumley for her most generous assistant. Her most generous donation has helped save many school children's and teachers lives from COVID-19.

Rotary club of THE HIMALAYAN GURKHAS is a relatively young club in Rotary world, with its installation in September 2003. According to the Charter President Major Gopal Bahadur Gurung MBE, the first few years were challenging as the club had to learn the norms of Rotary. However, with most of Charter members being former Gurkhas with extensive international experience, "tricks of the Rotary trades" were learnt quickly and implemented in the club. Within a short span of time the club had a calendar full of activities, keeping members busy.

The Himalayan Gurkhas began working with Rotarians from overseas which attracted much

needed funds to help needy people of the remote hills. The list projects initiated by the club included, Health camps, drinking water, school classrooms, installation of IT suits in schools, provision of internet in the remote hill schools, poverty alleviation, Micro Loans Schemes to help start, Poultry, Goat farms and piggery, post Nepal earthquake rehabilitation work and so on. The club has no permanent office nor any place to keep historical records.

Because of the situation above club has had to look into an alternative way of preserving the historical records of the club. Thus came the Rotary Monument idea. Rotary Monument (Chautari) is





brainchild of Major Lilbahadur GURUNG MBE. It is conveniently located at the main entrance of Nepal's first home stay tourism village Sirubari in Syangja, where many internal as well as the international visitors come and stay. For Sirubari and the visitors to the home stay village, Rotary Monument has become a "shop window". It has also attracted many selfie lovers and visitors and visiting Rotarians, who capture it in their devices before leaving.

The monument has the names of the Charter President and the Presidents, Major Donors from various countries, Major individual donors, Donor International clubs and list of all projects including the post Nepal earthquake rehabilitation projects and support given to needy people during the Covid – 19 Pandemic inscribed on marble.



सचिव डा. प्रविण मिश्रको पहलमा भक्तपुर जिल्ला अस्पतालको लागि बनाइएको ४/५ वर्ष देखि खाली रहेको नव निर्मित भवन प्रत्यारोपण कार्यक्रमको लागि दिइयो र आज यस शहीद धर्मभक्त राष्ट्रिय प्रत्यारोपण केन्द्रले १० वर्षको अवधिमा १,००० जना भन्दा बढिको मृर्गौला प्रत्यारोपण ९९ प्रतिशत सफलताका साथ सम्पन्न गरेको छ ।



KIDS ALOUD 2019

AN INTERNATIONAL MUSICAL EXTRAVAGANZA HARROGATE, NORTH YORKSHIRE, UNITED KINGDOM

The Year 2019 AD is a historic year for the Nepalese school children as it is during this year, 20 students and 5 teachers from SHREE TRI SHAHID HIGH SCHOOL, Andhi Khola – 1, Syangja and 20 students and 6 teachers from Valley Public High school, Sundar Basti, Bhangal, were selected to join children from 14 British schools in North Yorkshire and participate in an international musical extravaganza, named KIDS ALOUD – 2019, at Harrogate, North Yoyrkshire. The event took place on the 29th and 30th of March 2019.

KIDS ALOUD is a major International Musical Extravaganza for school age children, which has been on going in Rotary District 1040 for more than a decade. It is one of the most popular projects carried out annually by Rotary and is appreciated by many parents and the locals of the Harrogate area in Yorkshire, England, United Kingdom. The idea of Nepali children participating in and international musical event in the UK came from the visiting Rotarians from Harrogate, Yorkshire during their IT project visit in Nepal. However, the huge administrative and logistical tasks ahead were not for the faint-hearted. Having several virtual meetings between the key members of the project team in the UK and in Nepal the final decision to launch the project was made in Spring 2017. There was joy all-round. It was a once in a lifetime opportunity for the Nepali children and the participating lucky teachers, of which I am one.

The selection of children and the teachers was carried out in July 2018. Thereafter, the training for the entire participants began in Kathmandu and in Sirubari simultaneously. During the selection, children's aptitude towards music and plays were considered high priority. Their health, discipline

skills in cultural program and their ability to learn quickly were also taken into consideration. Several difficulties had to be negotiated carefully by international coordinator of the Kids Aloud 2019, Major Lilbahadur GURUNG MBE. One such difficulty was of course raising of £100,000 for Nepalese children and the teachers to participate in KA2019. The fund required was for air tickets, UK Visa, dress for the children, including cultural and Nepali national dress, medical insurance for 40 children and 13 teachers. Valley Public High school and friends of international coordinator came to rescue with the funds.

With UK Visa approved and medical examinations completed in late February, the KA2019

participants left for Manchester airport in the UK in mid-March for 3 weeks of hectic but potentially rewarding trip. The entire Nepali entourage was given a rousing farewell by members of the RC THE HIMALAYAN GURKHAS and Valley Public family.

The Nepali entourage arrived in Manchester amidst a typical English weather, tired but high in spirit. They were received by international coordinator and the key members of the KA2019, Namely, Andrew Morrison – KA2019 project leader, Guy Wilson, Barry Pollard and President of Brigands Ruth Townrow. Captain (Retd) Rajendra Man Gurung of Sirubari made himself available and was in the welcome group.

During their time in Yorkshire and leading to KA2019 finale children visited more than dozen schools, historical sites, museum, and tropical zoo to name the few. KA practices and rehearsals were carried out in each school with the British children.

Then came the "D" day that everyone was waiting for. The Royal Hall was full to it's capacity with local dignitaries, parents and the guardians of children of local participating schools. The

Micro Loan Scheme (MLS) was first introduced to Panchamul Valley by visiting Rotarians from Rotary International District 1040, England, United Kingdom in late 2012. Rotary International district 1040 and several Rotary clubs, namely, Harrogate Brigantes, Northallerton, Northallerton Mobray, Bingley Airedale, Knaresborough and individual Rotarians have contributed in this scheme. 5. In addition to the projects mentioned above several additional projects in 2017 and in 2018. The projects in brief are as follows:

- a. Goat Bank 1, Vakimle, Syangja: Goat Bank 1 was the first project of it's kind in Panchamul valley. The entire goat herd was under one roof with a dedicated goat herder. The project had a great start with visiting Rotarians from the donor club Northallerton Rotary inaugurating the Goat Farm. For the first 8 months or so, all was going well. However, with rapid proliferation of the goats the shade became too small and the herder also had difficulty managing it proper. It was then decided to divide goats into several smaller herds for the ease of administration and management. The herds are now managed by 4 smaller farms run by a family. Rotary club of Northallerton are thanked for making the fund available.
- **b.** Goat Bank 2, Dhakalthok, Syangja: The project site/location and the person in charge has been changed from Dhakalthok to Malkudanda, to suit the circumstances. The new location Malkudanda is North of Sirubari village. The area is open grazing land and is suitable for Sheep grazing. The farm has Sheep's instead of Goats.





- c. The funds for the Goat Bank 1 and 2 came from Northallerton and Northallerton Mobray respectively.
- d. Periodical updates are sent to the donor club with informative photographs.

6. Poultry Farm Sirkhu, Syangja:

- i. Project launched in November 2020
- ii. Total fund received: £ 1000.00
- iii. Funds collected at Kids Aloud 2019 performance was made available by Harrogate Brigantes Rotary club.
- iv. Project is progressing well.

7. Conclusion:

For the past 9 years or so many needy people in Panchamul valley have benefitted immensely from the Micro Loan Scheme. It was even more so during the lockdown period due to COVID-19 as MLS was only means of income for survival to the locals as there was no alternative way of making money.

The project has been a great success due to hard work and dedication of the Group Leaders. I thank the Group Leaders for their selfless devotion to work.

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CHANGING LIVES

One Classroom at a time

Across rural Nepal, the majority of young children attend schools that are in a poor condition, with very few resources. They are taught by untrained teachers who use rote learning methods that only teach repetition without understanding.

Sitting on dirty and unsafe floors with nothing to occupy them, the youngest children are often the lowest priority in the school and sometimes left without a teacher present.

Without a real foundation, these children are being hampered in their learning and the lack of training and motivation in their teachers is passed on to them in the form of ineffective education.

Nepal based NGO First Steps Nepal is changing that one classroom at a time. With the support of the Rotary Clubs of The Himalayan Gurkhas in Nepal and Rotary Clubs of Kirriemuir, Scotland early years classes in eight schools in Syangja District are being transformed into nurturing child friendly learning environments as part of a five year programme.

Founded by Nepali, Durga Aran, First Steps Nepal works in rural schools to transform early years classrooms through teacher training and support. "Teachers are trained in contemporary teaching methods that support children to becoming



peaceful, nurturing learning environments" explains Durga



Following a visit to Syangja with representatives of the Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas, Kathmandu, the project was planned working in eight schools that stretch out from the town of Walling to surrounding hill villages reached only by four wheel drive vehicle on rough mountain tracks.





Rotarians organised the delivery and fit out of carpet, paint and classroom furniture.

First Steps Nepal had already worked for many years with rotary clubs in District 1010 Scotland and was known for its effective early years project work. When the Syangja project was conceived by the Kirriemuir Rotary club - Scotland and The Rotary club of Himalayan Gurkhas, Kathmandu Nepal, First Steps Nepal was asked to coordinate the early years part of the project.

The story was similar in all of the schools. Classrooms were bare and dilapidated and teachers had no learning resources. However, once classrooms were painted, carpeted and fitted out with low tables suited to young children, the project turned to supporting the teachers to have a better understanding of child friendly methods.

Soon, children were starting to enjoy their classes, becoming much more focused and eager to explore and learn. They attended more regularly and gained a love of learning. Teachers began to realise that child - friendly teaching methods were easy to implement and were in fact more enjoyable for everyone!

Teacher Training

First Steps Nepal provided a series of practical hands on teacher training workshops in contemporary practices. These were well received from teachers who previously had no idea about classroom layout and how to create their own learning materials from basic items found locally.

Teachers begin to see the importance of active movement for young children in their overall development as well as understand the key concepts of behaviour management. Each workshop held over a week encouraged the teachers to supplement the curriculum with a variety of fun activities that would engage in the children in their learning.

Monitoring

A local supervisor visits each school on a regular basis to check on progress and support teachers with new ideas and activities. Teachers are assessed on their use of child friendly teaching techniques, behaviour management and the creation and use of resources. The First Steps Nepal management team conduct twice yearly monitoring visits to assess progress, talk to head teachers and make recommendations.

Challenges

Any project in rural Nepal is bound to face all sorts of challenges, but no one could have foreseen COVID and its impact on the project. Suddenly Nepal was under lock down, schools were closed and movement very restricted. Both the rotary clubs and First Steps Nepal agreed on using this period to prepare training that could be delivered either online or face to face. The result was an even better more robust training course that has raised the bar in training delivery and outcomes for teachers.

Other challenges have included the geographical location of some schools, the lack of class teachers for young children who instead are taught by a rotation of subject teachers. Ideally, young children should have their own dedicated class teacher, and this has been difficult to achieve in some schools due to staffing.

Project Director Durga Aran says "It has been fantastic to see how simple changes and a bit of training can bring about transformation in the way that young children are taught. I am so pleased that teachers are now so much more motivated and really enjoy what they do. Working with the Rotary Club of Himalayan Gurkhas has been an absolute pleasure. They really got involved and helped us organise the fit out the classrooms working into the long hours to complete the job. They continued to coordinate with us to ensure smooth operations."



As the current 5-year project comes to a close in March 2024, First Steps Nepal are already in discussion with rotary clubs for the next phase in Syangja.

This will involve opening up teacher training for more schools in the Walling area and refresher training for teachers who show commitment and motivation.

अवस्थित संयुक्त राष्ट्रसंघको खाद्य वितरण केन्द्रतर्फ जाँदै गरेकी कममा खिचिएको हो । ती नानी कुपोषित भएकी कारणले ढलेको अवस्थामा थिइन् र एउटा गिद्ध उनको मृत्युको पर्खाइमा थियो ।



RENEWABLE ENERGY FUTURE OF NEPAL

Nepal has enormous potential for pumped storage hydro power as per the study conducted by The Global Pumped Hydro Storage Atlas. According to the Atlas Nepal has about 2800 good sites combined storage capacity of 50 TWh which is sufficient to balance out any variability coming from Solar and run of river hydro Renewable Energy has been a key topic of discussion around the world in recent years as almost every country around the world in some shape or form has been impacted by the climate change. Nepal has been identified as one of the highly vulnerable nation that will be impacted by climate change due to its variation in geographic, economic, social, and political landscape.¹ However, Nepal is not staying indifferent to combat this detrimental impact of climate change. Nepal has pledged in the Paris Agreement that as a country, we will accelerate climate action through bold policy-making, inclusive social trans- formation and technological advancements. Nepal has committed to achieving net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2045 to establish itself as a carbon neutral, and climate resilient country.² But, how do we go from a net carbon emission now in early 2020s to a net zero emission by 2045? The Nepalese government has published its Long-term Strategy for Net zero Emissions in 2021 identifying various strategical sectors including energy usage, agriculture, industrial sector, forestry, and land use to take our country to net-zero emissions by mid-century. As an renewable engineering graduate, I was naturally curious about the long term strategy laid out by our government for the energy sector, energy usage and generation, and the role of renewable energy beyond Hydro power in supplying clean energy needs of future Nepalese citizens.

Anyone who has ever listened to the news in the last 15-20 years knows that Nepal has a large hydropower generation potential which not only can ensure affordable and renewable source of electricity to Nepalese citizens, but can also ensure prosperity of the country by selling the electricity produced to our neigh boring countries including India and Bangladesh. However, hydropower is not the only renewable energy resource that Nepal can tap into. A study in 2021³ has estimated that the solar potential of Nepal is as large as 100 times more than what Nepalese citizen can consume even when they consume energy at the per capita consumption rate of developed countries. To go along with the solar potential, Nepal's geography also allows for pumped storage hydro that can act as a large scale long duration energy storage during periods of low/ no sunshine. With all this potential known for Nepal what are some of the ongoing activities within the renewable energy space in Nepal?

Solar Energy

On the solar front, earlier this year, Nepal's largest solar power station (as of July 2023) came online

in Nuwakot⁴ and has been supplying electricity to residents of Kathmandu valley via Devighat Hydropower station. However, this is not the only solar power plant that is connected to Nepalese power grid. Ever since, the Nepalese government announced its plan to install around 500 MW of Solar power in the country by 2023 in 2018, both private and public sec- tor have been working towards developing solar power plants in Nepal. Whilewe haven't reached the goal that was envisioned back in 2018,⁵ we have been making strides towards the goal. As of early 2023, Nepal has about 55 MW of solar power connected to the national power grid, with additional 135 MW under active construction⁶ and another 747 MW under considerations/being surveyed. If most of these projects come online, they will set up Nepal in a right track to achieve its goal of getting to around 2.1 GW of grid connected solar capacity by 2050 to operate as a carbon emission free country. Some of the ways that solar energy can support Nepalese economy are through electricity export, less reliance on imported petroleum by switching to electricity based cooking compared to LPG based, use of solar energy for water pumping

for agricultural use etc. On top of that Nepal can also possibly generate carbon revenue from electricity trade as the incentives for reducing carbon emissions and minimizing climate change can become more competitive.

Hydropower



Hydropower has been recognized as one of the major source of energy in Nepal that can play an important role in Nepal's future economy and energy independence. However, some studies suggest that the hydro potential is a tiny fraction of the solar PV potential in Nepal.7 Currently, hydropower plants with a combined capacity of approx. 2.2 GW have been installed in Nepal with most of the hydropower plant being run-of-river type which power production varies according to seasonal variation and provide little storage or the ability to operate as baseload power plant. Earlier this year, an agreement was reached to increase the capacity to import-export electricity through the 400 KV Dhalkebar-Muzaffarpur transmission line between India and Nepal by 200 MW, increasing it from 600 MW (megawatts) to 800 MW. This essentially allows hydropower generated in Nepal to be exported to other South Asian countries including India and Bangladesh ensuring the carbon emission of the entire region is reduced. While Hydropower can be a great source of renewable energy, hydropower can also cause some level of environmental destruction including displacement of people, flooding of farmland, destruction of river ecosystems, forest clearance and methane release due to the decay

of a large number of plants and organic residues. So a balance should be maintained in the amount of Hydropower capacity required to take Nepal to net-zero emissions by mid-century and the possible environmental and ecological shifts it can bring.

Wind Energy




As of now, Nepal doesn't have a single wind power plant that is connected to the nation's power grid. One of the reason behind no wind power plant in Nepal's grid is the region in which Nepal has some wind potential is in a remote location close to Himalayas where it is cost-prohibitive to install wind turbines and the grid is not available for interconnection as well. Due to the lower potential of wind as well as the geographical challenges, wind has not been considered as a key player in Nepal's path to net zero emissions.

Pumped Storage Hydro

Pumped storage hydropower plant works by pumping water from a lower to an upper reservoir when energy cost is lower or excess energy is available in the grid and allowing the water to run down through a turbine at a later time to recover the energy when the energy cost is higher or the supply in the grid is low. Pumped storage hydro can essentially serve as long duration energy storage for a future grid of Nepal where we may have both short duration variability coming from solar and long duration variability from run-of-

river hydropower plants. Nepal has enormous potential for pumped storage hydro power as per the study conducted by The Global Pumped Hydro Storage Atlas.⁸ According to the Atlas Nepal has about 2800 good sites combined storage capacity of 50 TWh which is sufficient to balance out any variability coming from Solar and run of river hydro. As such, pumped storage hydro should play as key role in Nepal's future with net-zero emissions. As the Nepalese government moves toward achieving the ambition of minimizing emissions and achieve netzero emissions by 2045, it is essential to lookinto various source of renewable energy available in Nepal and what kind of role they would play in Nepal's renewable energy future. As per the information, we have as of late it seems like Solar, hydropower and pumped storage hydro have a crucial role to play for Nepal's road to net-zero emissions.

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

I met Ann and Barry in July 2013 in Chesire. It was my courtesy visit to the donors of The Himalayan Gurkhas and Ann and Barry were in the top of the priority list of our donors. Since this was our first meeting, I was a bit nervous about how to thank them both for their huge support to Nepali people. To my pleasant surprise, we were talking and discussing various matters as if we had known each other for many years. We had a lovely lunch and I presented Ann and Barry with the "Token of love" on behalf of RC The Himalayan Gurkhas.

During our meeting, both Ann and Barry expressed their interest in helping needy people

in the Third World countries, mainly in literacy, health, poverty elimination and in natural disasters.

As a result of their interest in helping needy people in the Third World countries I suggested they were interested in looking into funding for a childcare center. After few more personal meetings in Chesire and many emails exchanged, Ann and Barry committed themselves to help building a brand-new building, fully equipped, and staffed to house 28 children (14 boys and 14 girls). The center would be named after their late daughter Charlotte, who died of cancer,

at a young age, leaving two young children motherless and her husband Dave. The name of the center was decided by Barry and Ann to be "CHARLOTTE'S HAVEN ON EARTH NEPAL"

The construction work took almost 2 years to complete and was disturbed by Nepal Earthquake of April 2015. The Charlotte's Haven on Earth childcare center was formally inaugurated by Ann and Barry on 16th of January 2016. Charlotte's family, husband Dave and children Chloe and Tom joined from Australia to be part of the inauguration program. Several local dignitaries, teachers, students, and well-wishers were also invited to witness the grand opening of the center. For the 28 children, the day was the beginning of the new dawn in their lives. Charlotte's Haven on Earth childcare center is fully funded by Eifion Trust, a registered charity established by Ann and Barry.

Ann and Barry made their second visit to Charlotte's Haven on Earth childcare center in April 2017, despite them being both physically frail. The visit was to meet the children but most importantly to attend Charlotte's memorial service. It is true testimony of their love and affection to the children in the Charlotte's Haven on Earth center.

Sadly, their second visit to Charlotte's center was to be their final visit, because of the Covid-19 and their deteriorating health. Barry kept us informed every now and then and gave their health update as well as asking about the welfare of the children in the center. For Charlotte's Haven on Earth childcare center family, December 2021 and January 2022 were the saddest of all as during this short time span both Barry and Ann left this world for Heavenly abode. The children, staff and the CHoE Board are deeply saddened by their loss, but grateful for the enormous support that they have given. The time we had together will be remembered. They may be gone but their memory will live on forever. Ann and Barry touched the lives of so many people with their kindness and generosity. Barry and Ann, Grandpa and Granny to all children and Sir and Ma'am to the staff and CHoE Board, you may have left CHoE family far too soon, but your loving presence will endure forever in our hearts and souls. It hurts so much you're gone but we are





so grateful for the time we shared together. You brought so much joy and happiness to so many young lives and we will never forget you.

We know what you left behind in Charlotte's Haven on Earth childcare center will be taken care of by your siblings and Eifion Trust. I on behalf of CHOE would make sure the legacy you started and left behind in our hands, will be managed to the best of our knowledge and help produce disciplined manpower with high morale for the world and for our nation. Do bless your grandchildren in Charlotte's Haven on Earth and those who have been and gone from high above.

Your legacy will live on, Rest in Peace Ann and Barry. We all miss you more than words can express.





Enhancing Water and Sanitation Facilities at Shree Chyamra Devi Secondary School, Sertung Village, 2-Ruby Valley

Sertung Village is nestled within the scenic landscapes of Ruby Valley Rural Municipality, situated in Dhading, Nepal, at an elevation of 1950 meters (6,435 feet). This picturesque village is located approximately 135 kilometers away from the bustling heart of Kathmandu. The local administrative landscape has undergone a transformation, consolidating Tipling VDC, Sertung VDC, and Lapa VDC into the cohesive entity now known as Ruby Valley Rural Municipality. The moniker "Ruby Valley" finds its origins in the presence of the precious gemstone "Ruby," an emblem of the region's natural wealth. Notably, the Ruby Valley, nestled within the embrace of the Ganesh Himal Region, stands as Nepal's preeminent locale for the discovery of the finest "Ruby Stone."

Culturally, Sertung Village stands as a tapestry interwoven with the vibrant traditions of Tamang, Gurung, Ghale, Newar, and Dalit communities. At the heart of this cultural mosaic lies the Shree Chyamra Devi Secondary School, established in the year 2034 B.S. (1977 AD). This educational institution serves as a haven for 407 students, ranging from Grade 1 to Grade 10.

However, a stark reality casts a shadow over this educational sanctuary's history. Astonishingly, in its five decades of existence, the school had never possessed adequate restroom facilities, barring a diminutive single-room lavatory that was woefully insufficient for the needs of over 500 individuals. The absence of separate facilities for gentlemen and ladies further compounded this challenge. It was within this context that the



notion of a toilet project took root - a project that would leave an indelible mark on the school and the lives of the more than 50,000 individuals who utilize it annually with modern facilities like enough running water, wall-to-wall tiled and sanitary disposal pit.

Responding to this critical need, the Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas embarked on a monumental endeavor. With the invaluable financial support from Rotary International (RI) and The Rotary Foundation (TRF), a transformative feat was accomplished: а comprehensive, 10-room restroom facility crafted from robust concrete, designed to be inclusive for differently-abled individuals as well. The significance of this initiative reverberates through the annals of Sertung village, within Ruby Valley Rural Municipality, Dhading, Nepal, leaving an enduring imprint on the edifice of Shree Chyamra Higher Secondary School.

The realization of this project was a testament to the synergistic efforts of diverse stakeholders. The collaborative spirit of the Local Government, the authority of Ward # 3, the School Management Committee, the resolute School Principal and dedicated educators, parents, and the expansive network of RI District 3292, alongside Rotary Club of Hamakita, Japan and the esteemed local host club - Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas coalesced to bring this transformative vision to fruition.

The project was headed by Rtn. Major Bhim Bahadur Gurung, MVO, MBE and local coordinator was Rtn. Kul Bahadur Gurung. And Rtn. Kajuko Nakano was the focal person from RC Hamakita, Japan. Total cost of the project was NPR. 9,573,421.13 received from RC Hamakita, RI District 21484, Japan through Rotary International (RI). The school caters to a total of 407



students, comprising 125 female students and 282 male students. The student body represents a diverse tapestry of communities, including Tamang, Gurung, Newar, Ghale, and Dalit (Blacksmith) backgrounds.

Dhading Besi serves as the administrative headquarters of Dhading district, positioned approximately 75 km away and requiring a

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3-hour drive from the capital city, Kathmandu. The journey from Dhading Besi to Kimtang Phedi (In 2019 AD) is extended to 5 hours when utilizing local jeeps and trucks just for 27km. Subsequently, accessing the project site mandates a challenging trek of at least 2 ½ days on foot. These transportation limitations pose significant hurdles to our construction efforts.

The roadways remain accessible for only six months each year, largely due to the formidable monsoon season. Negotiating the peculiarities of transporting construction materials exacerbates the situation. impeding the mobilization of local laborers and mules alike. The harsh combination of monsoon rains, landslides, muddied trails, river crossings, leeches, rockfalls, and the scarcity of adept workers and technicians well-versed in functioning within such a demanding geographic







terrain, collectively present an incredibly daunting scenario for the project committee.

The project was completed with construction of 5 ladies' and 5 gents' toilet rooms. This encompasses a accessible toilet and waste disposal pits. Communication hurdles stemming from intermittent telephone network connectivity had been a persistent issue. Moreover, addressing on-site medical emergencies and fostering a comprehensive comprehension of the project's significance among the local populace were additional critical challenges on the ground.

A heartfelt expression of gratitude extended to Mrs. Mariko Muramatsu from Japan, whose unwavering commitment played a pivotal role in the success of this project. Her selfless dedication was instrumental in fostering coordination, cooperation, and seamless communication between the members of RC Hamakita and the Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas. Mrs. Muramatsu's voluntary visits to Nepal, undertaken numerous times to oversee the project's progress, along with her tireless efforts in meticulous documentation, both from Nepal and Japan, have been invaluable contributions to the realization of this endeavor.

Special acknowledgments are extended to the board members of Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas, whose strategic guidance and unwavering commitment were instrumental in the success of this project. The project committee members also merit recognition for their dedicated efforts, as their meticulous planning and execution played a crucial role in bringing this initiative to fruition.

Special gratitude is extended to Rtn. Bil Bahadur Gurung from RC Hamakita, Japan; whose involvement and support significantly contributed to the project's realization. His collaborative efforts bridged distances and fostered unity in purpose.

Equally deserving of appreciation are the local individuals who lent their support on the ground. Their collective efforts were essential in overcoming challenges and ensuring the project's smooth progression. It is their dedication and involvement that have transformed the vision into a tangible reality.


TECHNOLGY TOURNAMENT

SCHOOLS IN PANCHAMUL VALLEY AND IN WALING, SYANGJA

Technology Tournament has been ongoing in RI District 1040 for over a decade. Technology Tournaments are a challenging and enjoyable way for young people to enrich their STEM learning (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths).

Technology Tournament was imported to Nepali schools by the visiting Rotarians in 2014 lead by IT Guru Andrew Morrison. The first tournament was held at Shree Tri Shahid High school, Panchamul.

Of the 6 high schools and one Lower secondary school, all had to fill in 3 teams of four students each with age brackets: 9 - 11, 12 - 14 and 15/16. They had to solve an interactive technology-based task and are required to design, develop,

and build a solution with the materials supplied to them.

The competitors are briefed and allowed to discuss with the team members and ask questions to the judges and stewards if any. The teams are then given 4 hours to complete their task. Once Tournaments culminate in the testing session when teams demonstrate their best solution to the task and can observe the efforts of other competing teams.



कुनै पनि संघ, संस्था, संगठन तथा क्लव एउटा निश्चित उदेश्य लिएर स्थापना भएको हुन्छ । सामाजिक सेवा तथा विकास गर्ने उद्धेश्यका साथ यस्ता संस्थाहरू स्थापना भएका हुन्छन । उक्त सामाजिक संघ, संस्थाहरू स्थापना हुनु अघि एउटा विधान तयार गरी विधानमा उल्लेख गरिए वमोजिमको कार्यविधि अपनाइ आफ्ना गतिविधिहरू अगाडी वढाइएका हुन्छन । यसै क्रममा वहुसंख्यक भु.पु.वेलायती सेनाहरूको संलग्नतामा शिक्षा, स्वास्थ्य र समाजका विविध पक्षको विकास निर्माणमा सहयोग पऱ्याउने लक्ष्यका साथ सन २००३ सेप्टेम्वर १० तारिखका दिन रोटरी क्लव अफ दि हिमालयन् गुर्खाजको स्थापना भएको देखिन्छ ।

उक्त क्लवको सचिवालय काठमाडौंको लाजिम्पाटमा अवस्थित छ । उक्त क्लवले खोटाङ जिल्लाको रावावेसी र ऐंसेलुखर्क गाउँपालिकालाई पनि आफ्नो सेवा क्षेत्र छनोट गरेको थियो । यसै कममा उक्त क्लवका भु.पु.अध्यक्ष तथा वेलायती सेनावाट अवकास प्राप्त सैनिक युवराज गुरुडको त्रिभुवन मा. वि. ऐसेलुखर्कमा स्थलगत भ्रमण पश्चात एउटा सुविधा सम्पन्न अपांगमैत्री शौचालयको आवश्यकता महशुस भएपछि वहाँकै सिफारिस र पहलमा उक्त क्लव मार्फत त्रिभुवन मा.वि. ऐंसेल्खर्क र गंगोदय मा.वि. द्वेकोलमा १, १ वटा अपांगमैत्री शौचालय भवन निर्माण योजना प्राप्त भयो। योजना प्राप्त हनासाथ विद्यालयले उक्त क्लवसँग सम्भौता गरी वि.व्य.स. मार्फत शौचालय भवन निर्माण कार्यको थालनी गऱ्यो। शौचालय निर्माणको अवधिमा समय समयमा उक्त क्लवका पदाधिकारीहरूवाट अनगमन गरियो । कोभिड-१९ को असर कायमै रहिरहेको अवधिमा उक्त क्लवका अध्यक्ष श्रीप्रसाद गुरुङ र भु.पु. अध्यक्ष युवराज गुरुङवाट प्रत्येक विद्यार्थीहरूलाई ३, ३ गोटाका दरले कपडाको मास्क समेत उपलब्ध गराइयो। शौचालय निर्माण कार्यको प्रारम्भको समयमा विश्वव्यापी रुपमा देखा परेको कोभिड-१९ को असरले केही समय विलम्व भएपनि समयसिमा भित्रै योजना सम्पन्न भयो । २०७८/११/१२ गतेका दिन यस ऐसेलुखर्क गा.पा. का तत्कालीन अध्यक्ष विश्वनाथ निरौला, उपाध्यक्ष पृष्पकला भुजेल, वडाध्यक्ष राजेश कुमार राजभण्डारी, वि. व्य. अध्यक्ष टेकेन्द्र राजभण्डारी, रावावेसी गा.पा. अध्यक्ष लिलानाथ निरौला, उक्त क्लवका अध्यक्ष सत्त वहादुर गुरुङ, भु.पु.अध्यक्षहरू श्रीप्रसाद गुरुङ, युवराज गुरुङ, सेक्रेटरी मोहन गुरुड, साविक दुवेकोल गा.वि.स.का अध्यक्ष रत्न वहाद्र गुरुङ, सिंगापुर प्रहरीवाट अवकाश प्राप्त रविन गुरुङ र धनमान घले लगायतका महानुभावहरूको व्यापक उपस्थितिमा उक्त अपांगमैत्री सुविधा सम्पन्न शौचालयको चाबि विद्यालयका प्र.अ. टेक वहादुर क्षेत्रीलाई हस्तान्तरण गरियो । सोही दिन उक्त क्लवको तर्फवाट आएका महिला सदस्यहरूको टोलीवाट यस विद्यालयमा कार्यरत विद्यालय नर्स तथा छात्राहरूलाई स्यानीटरी प्याडको प्रयोग विधिवारे जानकारी दिनुका साथै स्यानीटरी प्याड समेत वितरण गरियो।



शौचालय हस्तान्तरणकै दिन उक्त क्लव र गाउँ कार्यपालिकाको कार्यालय ऐंसेलुखर्कको साभोदारीमा यस विद्यालयलाई प्राप्त भएको २ कोठे RCC पक्की भवन निर्माण योजनाको सिलान्यास क्लवका अध्यक्ष सत्त वहादर गुरुङ र ऐसेलुखर्क गा.पा. का तत्कालिन अध्यक्ष विश्वनाथ निरौलावाट गरियो । उक्त RCC भवन निर्माण योजना वापत त्रिभ्वन मा. वि. ऐंसेल्खर्क र माक्पा मा. वि. माक्पालाई रोटरी क्लव अफ दि हिमालयन् गुर्खाजको पहलमा, रोटरी डिस्टिक ३२९२ को ERRRP परियोजनाको तर्फवाट रु. १४,००,०००/-, गाउँ कार्यापालिकाको कार्यालय ऐंसेलखर्कको तर्फवाट रु.१०,००,०००/- र रोटरी क्लब अफ दि हिमालयन गुर्खाजका सदस्यहरू र स्थानीयहरूको तर्फबाट रु ५,००,०००/- गरी जम्मा ३०,००,०००/- प्रदान गरिएको थियो। हाल उक्त दुवै विद्यालयहरूमा भवन निर्माण कार्य सम्पन्न भई प्रयोगमा ल्याइएको छ ।

शिक्षामा निजी शिक्षण संस्थाको योगदान

रोटरीयन कृष्णप्रसाद अधिकारी. पूर्व अध्यक्ष, रोटरी क्लब दि हिमालयन गुर्खाज् केन्द्रीय उपाध्यक्ष, निजी तथा आवासीय विद्यालय अर्गनाइजेसन (प्याब्सन)

आधुनिक शिक्षाको शालनी हुनुअधि अर्थात् प्राचीन सयममा गुरुकुल शिक्षा पद्धति थियो । नित्यकर्म पश्चात गुरूको समीपमा बसेर विद्याआर्जन गर्नुपर्श्यो । ब्राह्रमणहरूले वेद, दर्शन, नीतिशास्त्र, पुराण, ज्योतिषि, व्याकरण, न्याय, कर्मकाण्ड लगायतका विषय अध्ययन गर्दथे । क्षेत्रीयहरूले शस्त्र सञ्चालनका सीप, राजनीति, ढण्डनीति, अर्थशास्त्र लगायतका ज्ञान हासिल गर्दथे । वैश्यहरूले व्यापारकला, कृषि लगायतका सीप हासिल गर्दथे । लिच्छविकालमा वैदिक र बौद्ध शिक्षा बढी प्रचलित थियो । मल्लकालमा ब्राह्मणिक शिक्षाले बौद्ध शिक्षाभन्दा विकास गर्न शाल्यो । दुवै कालमा शिक्षामा विभेद गरिएको शिएन । पृथ्वीनारायण शाहले युद्धमा आफूलाई व्यस्त राख्नुपरेकाले शिक्षातर्फ ध्यान दिन पाएनन् । त्यसताका गुरूकुलका शिक्षकहरूका लागि राज्यले गुठीको व्यवस्था गरिदिएको हन्थ्यो र त्यसको आयताबाट शिक्षकहरूले पारिश्रमिक पाउने गर्दथे । भेटीका रूपमा अन्न लगेर गरूको घरमा शिक्षा लिन जाने प्रचलन पाँच दशक अधिसम्म पनि थियो । शिक्षक प्रायः ब्राह्मण जातिकै हुन्थे । भीमसेन शापाले १८६१ सालमा कुशविर्ता हरण गरिदिए । त्यसले संस्कृत शिक्षालाई प्रभाव पाऱ्यो ।

बेलायतबाट तत्कालीन 'प्राइम मिनिस्टर एण्ड कमाण्डर इन चिफ' जङ्गबहादुर राणा स्वदेश फर्किएपछि १९१० मा आफ्नै दरबारमा स्कुल खोले । थापाथली दरबारको दाखचोकमा दरबार स्कुल खोलिएको थियो । १९१५ सालमा शिक्षा विभाग स्थापना गरी आफ्ना छोरा बबरजइ्गलाई पहिलो 'डाइरेक्टर' बनाए। पहिलो संस्कृत पाठशाला १९३२ सालमा भोजपुरमा खुल्यो । १९३४ सालमा काठमाडौंमा संस्कृत पाठशाला खोलियो । यी संस्कृत पाठशाला गुरुकुल शिक्षाको सुधारिएको स्वरुपका थिए । दरबारसँग पारिवारिक सम्बन्ध भएका कारण जयपृथ्वीबहादुर सिंहलाई विद्यालय खोल्न समस्या थिएन र उनले १९६३ सालमा नन्दकेशर वहालमा सत्यवादी स्कुल स्थापना गरे । सर्वसाधारणले निजी प्रयासमा आधुनिक शिक्षा प्रदान गर्ने पहिलो विद्यालय सिराहामा स्थापना गरे । हालको चन्द्र माध्यमिक विद्यालय १९७१ सालमा स्थापना गरिएको हो ।

शिक्षालय स्थापना गर्ने क्रम बढन थाल्यो। राणाकालिन समयमा छ थरिका शिक्षालय सञ्चालनमा रहेको देखिन्छ- स्रेस्ता पाठशाला, आधार स्कल, प्रौढ स्कल, संस्कृत पाठशाला, भाषा पाठशाला र टेक्निकल स्कुल । ति बाहेक धार्मिक शिक्षालय मदरसा र गुम्बा पनि थिए। आर्थिक आर्जन गर्नेभन्दा पनि सेवा गर्ने भावनाले व्यक्ति वा समाजले विद्यालय स्थापना गर्ने चलन थियो । विद्यालयमा शिक्षकका लागि पारिश्रमिक लिने चलन त थियो, तर स्वेच्छाले दिईन्थ्यो । केही विद्यालयमा मासिक शुल्क तोकिएकै पनि थियो । उच्च शिक्षा भने निःशुल्क नै थियो । २००५ साल मंसिर ४ गते गोरखापत्रमा प्रकाशित समाचारबाट पनि यस कुराको पुष्टी हुन्छ । पटना विश्वविद्यालयका प्रोफेसर त्रिचन्द्र कलेज निरीक्षण गरेर पटना लागे भन्ने समाचारमा "नेपालका कलेजमा बीएसम्म शिक्षा निःशुल्क रहेछ यस कुरामा हामीले बडो आश्चर्य मान्यौ" भनी उल्लेख हुनुले उच्च शिक्षा निःशुल्क रहेको प्रष्ट हुन्छ।



विद्यालय सञ्चालनमा थिए । नयाँ शिक्षा लागू हुनुपूर्व सरकारले निजी विद्यालयलाई पनि 'परफरमेन्स ग्रान्ट' भनेर अधिकतम चार हजार रुपियाँसम्म अनुदान दिने गरेको थियो । नयाँ शिक्षा लागू भएपछि निजी विद्यालयका प्रिन्सिपललाई मासिक साढे चार सय रुपियाँ र शिक्षकलाई मासिक डेढ सय रुपियाँ उपलब्ध गराउन थालियो । अब सरकारले निजी विद्यालयलाई राष्ट्रियकरण गर्न लाग्यो भन्ने भयले कतिपय त्यस्ता विद्यालयका सञ्चालकहरुले रकम बुफ्न चाहेनन् । २०३७ सालबाट त्यसरी अनुदान दिने व्यवस्था हटाइयो । अब निजी विद्यालयको आम्दानीको स्रोत भनेकै अभिभावक वा विद्यार्थीबाट उठाइने गरिएको शुल्क हुने भयो ।

निजी क्षेत्रमा हुँदै आएको शिक्षासम्बन्धी लगानीका बारेमा पहिलोपटक सन् २०१६ मा अध्ययन गरिएको थियो । संयुक्त राष्ट्रसंघीय शैक्षिक, वैज्ञानिक तथा सांस्कृतिक संगठन (युनेस्को) को इन्स्टिच्यूट फर स्ट्याटिस्टिक (युआईएस) र इन्टरनेसनल इन्स्टिच्यूट फर एजुकेसनल प्लानिङ (आईआईईपी)ले नेपालको शिक्षामा हुँदै आएको लगानीका बारेमा अध्ययन गरी विश्लेषण गरेको थियो । निजी क्षेत्रलाई समेत समेटेर विस्तृत रुपमा गरिएको यो नै हालसम्मको एकमात्र अध्ययन हो । अध्ययनका क्रममा सन् २००९ देखि २०१४ सम्मका तथ्याङ्कलाई समावेश गरिएको थियो । अर्थ मन्त्रालय, शिक्षा मन्त्रालय, केन्द्रीय तथ्याङ्क विभाग र महालेखा नियन्त्रणको कार्यालयबाट उपलब्ध गराइएको तथ्याङ्कका आधारमा शिक्षामा भइरहेको खर्चको लेखाजोखा गरिएको थियो ।

निजी शिक्षण संस्थामा पूर्वप्राथमिक तहमा प्रतिविद्यार्थी 9७ हजार ३३६ रुपियाँ, प्राथमिकमा २० हजार २५४ रुपियाँ, निम्न माध्यमिक तहमा १९ हजार ९८४ रुपियाँ, माध्यमिक (कक्षा ९-१०) तहमा ३१ हजार ६९६ रुपियाँ, कक्षा ११ र १२ मा ३७ हजार ७५२ रुपियाँ, प्राविधिक शिक्षामा ८९ हजार १५९ रुपियाँ र उच्च शिक्षामा प्रतिविद्यार्थी एक लाख ३१ हजार १३६ रुपियाँ खर्च हुँदै आएको सोही अध्ययनले देखाएको थियो । जबकी सामुदायिक विद्यालयमा पूर्वप्राथमिक तहमा प्रतिविद्यार्थी तीन हजार ६०२ रुपियाँ, प्राथमिक तहमा ११ हजार ५३६ रुपियाँ, निम्न माध्यमिक तहमा ११ हजार २५१ रुपियाँ, माध्यमिक तहमा १० हजार ६८१ रुपियाँ, कक्षा ११ र १२ मा १६ हजार ५२६ रुपियाँ तथा उच्च शिक्षामा प्रतिविद्यार्थी

५६ हजार ५२५ रुपियाँ खर्च हुँदै आएको थियो ।

नेपालमा व्यक्तिगत प्रयासमा विद्यालय स्थापना गरिएका हन्। ती निजी प्रयास थिए। राज्यले त सीमित विद्यालयमात्र स्थापना गऱ्यो। बाँकी त निजी प्रयास हुन्। विद्यार्थीबाट शुल्क उठाउने र त्यसैबाट घरभाडा तिर्ने, शिक्षकलाई पारिश्रमिक उपलब्ध गराउने, विद्यालय व्यवस्थापनमा खर्च गर्ने, लगानीकर्ताले पनि पारिश्रमिक लिने आदिको अभ्यास राणाकालदेखि नै भएका हुन् । १९९५ सालमा ठमेलमा ज्द्वोदय पब्लिक स्कुल स्थापना गर्न प्रतिविद्यार्थी एक रुपियाँ २५ पैसादेखि चार रुपियाँसम्म उठाउन पर्चा छपाएर उपत्यकामा बाँडियो र पहिलो वर्ष विद्यार्थीहरुबाट २७५ रुपियाँ उठेको थियो। २००३ सालमा पुतलीसडकमा स्थापित पद्मोदय विद्यालयले पहिलो वर्षमै साढे दुई हजार रुपियाँ चन्दा उठाएको थियो। २००३ साल माघ २८ गते पद्मोदय विद्यालयले गोरखापत्रमा छपाएको विज्ञापनको पुछारमा यस्तो लेखिएको थियो, "फिस् जुद्धोदय पब्लिक हाइस्कुल सरह हुनेछ ।" यसबाट विद्यार्थीले नियमित रूपमा शुल्क बुफाउन्पर्थ्यो भन्ने प्रष्ट हुन्छ। ती राज्यका विद्यालय थिएनन् । त्यो बेलाको परिभाषा गर्दा ती निजी थिए भन्ने तर्क गर्न सकिन्छ। हो, राज्यलाई कर तिर्नुपर्दैन थियो तर राज्यले महिनावारी रकम उपलब्ध गराउँदैन थियो । यसर्थ तिनलाई निजी विद्यालय भन्न नसकिने होइन । निजीको पछिल्लो परिभाषा फरक होला तर त्यो बेला ती निजीका परिभाषाभित्र अटाउँथे। एक्लो व्यक्तिको प्रयासमा स्थापना गरिएका विद्यालयलाई साम्दायिक भन्ने तर्क स्वीकार्न सकिँदैन।

हो, त्यसबेला निजी विद्यालय भनिँदैन थियो । शब्दावली फरक थियो - गैरसरकारी विद्यालय । गैरसरकारी विद्यालय भनेकै निजी हुन् । २०२२ साल फागुन ११ गतेको गोरखापत्रमा गैरसरकारी स्कुलको पढाइ शुल्क निर्धारण भन्ने शीर्षकमा समाचार छापिएको थियो । सरकारले काठमाडौँ उपत्यकाका गैरसरकारी शिक्षण संस्थाको पढाइ शुल्कको दर निश्चित गरेको कुरो समाचारमा उल्लेख थियो । श्रेणी मुताविक शुल्क लिई त्यसमा एक रुपियाँ बढाउन सकिने निर्णय गरियो । उदाहरणका रुपमा कक्षा १ मा दुई रुपियाँ लिन पाइन्थ्यो भने कक्षा दुईमा तीन रुपियाँ लिन पाइन्थ्यो । तिनताक सेक्सपियर स्कुल, मोर्डन इर्ड्लिस स्कुल लगायत खुलिसकेका थिए ।

लगानी

नयाँ शिक्षा लागू हुँदा उपत्यकाभित्र १५ वटा निजी



सन् २०१४/११ मा सार्वजनिक विद्यालयका अभिभावकले **90 अर्ब ५७ करोड रुपियाँ खर्च गरेको थिए भने निजी** विद्यालयका अभिभावकले ४७ अर्ब १४ करोड रुपियाँ खर्च गरेका थिए। निजी शिक्षण संस्थामा अध्ययन गरिरहेका कक्षा १० सम्मका विद्यार्थीबाट २२ अर्ब ६१ करोड रुपियाँ र त्यसभन्दा माथिबाट २४ अर्ब ४४ करोड रुपियाँ तिरेका थिए । त्यस वर्ष खाना, आवास र यातायातका लागि अभिभावकले चार अर्ब ३३ करोड रुपियाँ खर्च गर्नुपरेको थियो । सो वर्ष सम्पूर्ण विद्यार्थीको पोशाकका लागि छ अर्ब ७८ करोड रुपियाँ, पाठ्यपुस्तकका लागि १२ अर्ब ७७ करोड रुपियाँ, यातायातका लागि दुई अर्ब १९ करोड रुपियाँ, निजी ट्युसनका लागि तीन अर्ब ५४ करोड रुपियाँ, परीक्षाका लागि ३० करोड रुपियाँ अभिभावकले खर्च गरेका थिए। अभिभावकले शिक्षाका लागि गर्ने कुल खर्चको ६४.२ प्रतिशत विद्यालय शिक्षाका लागि खर्च गर्ने गरेका छन्। अभिभावकले पोशाकका लागि ६.९ प्रतिशत. पाठ्यपुस्तकका लागि १३.० प्रतिशत, यातायातका लागि २.२ प्रतिशत, खाजाका लागि ९.८ प्रतिशत, खाना तथा आवासका लागि ४.५ प्रतिशत, निजी ट्युसनका लागि ४.० प्रतिशत खर्च गर्ने गरेको अध्ययनले देखाएको छ।

अध्ययनले निजी शिक्षण संस्थाले खर्चको सबैभन्दा ठूलो हिस्सा शिक्षक कर्मचारीमा लगानी गर्ने गरेको देखाएको छ । शिक्षक कर्मचारीमा कुल खर्चको ४६.४ प्रतिशत, शिक्षण सामग्रीमा १.३ प्रतिशत, अन्य नियमितमा २८.४ प्रतिशत र पूँजीमा २३.८ प्रतिशत लगानी गर्ने गरिएको छ। अध्ययनको आधार वर्ष सन् २०१४/१४ मा निजी शिक्षण संस्थाहरुले शिक्षक कर्मचारीको तलब, शैक्षिक सामग्री, अन्य नियमित खर्च, खाना, आवास लगायतमा ४३ अर्ब ६८ करोड रुपियाँ खर्च गरेका थिए । यी तथ्यबाट निजी क्षेत्रले राज्यलाई लगानीको भार निकै हलुको बनाइदिएको प्रमाणित हन्छ । यही नै यथार्थ हो ।

निष्कर्ष

निजी शिक्षण संस्थाको इतिहास लामो भइसकेको छ । नेपालको समग्र शैक्षिक इतिहास लेख्वा निजी शिक्षण संस्थाको योगदानलाई नजरअन्दाज गरिएमा त्यो अन्याय हुनेछ । इतिहास लेखन अपूरो हुनेछ । आज निजी शिक्षण संस्थाकै कारण सामुदायिक विद्यालय प्रतिस्पर्धामा आउन चाहेका हुन्। गुणस्तर सुधार गर्न वाध्य भएका हुन्। निजी शिक्षण संस्था फष्टाउँदै जाने र सामुदायिक विद्यालय दुरावस्थामा जाने प्रवृत्तिका कारण राज्य र सामुदायिक विद्यालयका सरोकारवालामाथि नैतिक दबाब बढेको छ। सामुदायिक विद्यालयले आफ्ना प्रतिस्पर्धीका रूपमा निजी विद्यालयलाई ठान्नुले नेपालको शैक्षिक सुधारमा बल पुग्नेछ भन्ने कोणबाट पनि लिनुपर्छ। निजी विद्यालय कसैलाई बिगार्न, भत्काउन, ध्वस्त पार्न आएकै होइन । आमनागरिकलाई छनोटको अधिकार रहन्छ। जब देशमा अङ्ग्रेजी माध्यममा पठनपाठन गर्ने निजी विद्यालय कम थिए, अभिभावकले भारतका विभिन्न सहरमा आफ्ना छोराछोरीलाई पढाउन लैजाने गरेको देखिएकै थियो । निजी विद्यालयको सङ्ख्या थपिँदै जाँदा भारतमा लैजाने कम वा प्रवृत्ति पनि घट्दै गएको इतिहास सबैका सामू छ।



Revolutionizing Rural Education and Health Through Water and Sanitation Initiatives in Nepal (Global Grant No GG1983729)

In a transformative effort to improve the lives and futures of children in Nepal, an ambitious water and sanitation project has been completed by Rotary Club of The Himalayan Gurkhas, RI District 3292 Nepal and Rotary Club Kirriemuir RI district 1010, Scotland with the funding support from both club, districts, and UK FCDO (UK Direct Aids). With a focus on rural schools in Syangja, Gulmi, and Khotang districts. This initiative is poised to bring about profound changes that extend beyond mere infrastructure.

The core of this project involves the construction of essential toilet blocks in six schools spread across various villages. The significance of this endeavor cannot be overstated, as it addresses a critical need that has long hindered education and community development. These schools were selected through a collaborative process that puts the voices and needs of local communities at the forefront.

One of the primary factors in selecting these schools was the urgent demand expressed by the local communities. The lack of proper sanitation facilities has been a pressing concern, with existing toilets in various states of disrepair or nonexistence. Moreover, many of these schools have faced the brunt of natural disasters like earthquakes, leaving their infrastructure in shambles. This project is a beacon of hope for these communities, promising improved health and hygiene for their children.

Spanning across the rugged landscapes of rural Nepal, these schools often face challenging road

access. However, the difficulties of terrain have not deterred this project's determination to provide adequate facilities for every child. The project goes beyond the mere construction of toilets; it envisions separate provisions for boys, girls, students with disabilities, and the teachers who guide them. This inclusive approach ensures that every individual's needs are taken into account.

In line with modern standards of hygiene and sanitation, the facilities provided by this project extend to more than just toilets. Adequate handwashing facilities and incinerators are also incorporated into the infrastructure. These additions are not mere conveniences but integral components of creating a holistic and healthy learning environment.

Recognizing that knowledge is as crucial as infrastructure, the project includes a health education program. Installing toilets is not enough; teaching students, teachers, and nonteaching staff about proper hygiene practices is equally imperative. This educational aspect of the project is designed to be sustainable and impactful, aiming to instill habits that will improve the overall health and well-being of the school community.

The impact of this initiative is profound and farreaching. In total 2,369 students and 119 teaching and non-teaching staff members stand to benefit directly from these improved facilities. Beyond the immediate beneficiaries, the effects will ripple through generations of children attending



these schools, fostering healthier communities and stronger futures.

In conclusion, the water and sanitation project spanning the Syangja, Gulmi, and Khotang districts of Nepal stands as a testament to the transformative power of holistic initiatives. By addressing the immediate needs of sanitation infrastructure while also incorporating education and awareness, this project paves the way for a


